FLIGHT SAFETY NOTIFICATION DANGEROUS GOODS

Flight Safety Notifications (FSNs) are not mandatory in nature, but provide means such as guidance, methods, procedures and practices acceptable to the Authority for complying with regulations and other requirements in a systematic manner. These are not necessarily the only means of compliance. FSNs may also contain explanations of regulations, other guidance material, best practices or information useful to the aviation community. Unless incorporated into a regulation by reference, FSNs are not regulatory and do not create or change a regulatory requirement. A change of a regulatory requirement may come in the form of a Directive. A Flight Safety Notification is not a Directive.

PROHIBITION OF E-CIGARETTES AND OTHER BATTERY-POWERED PORTABLE ELECTRONIC SMOKING DEVICES

Purpose

This Flight Safety Notification (FSN) contains information prohibiting passengers and crew from carrying e-cigarettes and other battery-powered portable electronic smoking devices in checked baggage and from recharging the devices in aircraft cabins.

Background

Following an incident involving an e-cigarette heating element being accidentally activated and resulting in a fire in checked baggage in the cargo compartment, this FSN serves as a reminder that passengers and crew are prohibited from carrying e-cigarettes and other battery-powered portable electronic smoking devices in checked baggage and from recharging the devices in aircraft cabins. This International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO) requirement is contained in the current edition of the Technical Instructions for the Safe Transport of Dangerous Goods by Air (Doc 9284) and became effective June 15, 2015.

Applicability

This applies to all Air Operators and or agents acting on their behalf.

Effectivity

This Flight Safety Notification is effective immediately.

Action

- 1. The Air Operator and or agents acting on their behalf are to notify all passengers and crew that they are prohibited from carrying e-cigarettes and other battery-powered portable electronic smoking devices (includes e-cigs, e-cigars, e-pipes, personal vaporizers, electronic nicotine delivery systems) in checked baggage.
- 2. E-cigarettes and other battery-powered portable electronic smoking devices shall be carried by passengers or crew either in their carry-on baggage or on their person.
- 3. The recharging of e-cigarettes and other battery-powered portable electronic smoking devices and/or batteries on board the aircraft is prohibited.
- 4. The use of e-cigarettes and other battery-powered portable electronic smoking devices are not permitted within Jamaican airspace.
