Flight Safety Notification General

Flight Safety Notifications (FSNs) are not mandatory in nature, but provide means such as guidance, methods, procedures and practices acceptable to the Authority for complying with regulations and other requirements in a systematic manner. These are not necessarily the only means of compliance. FSNs may also contain explanations of regulations, other guidance material, best practices or information useful to the aviation community. Unless incorporated into a regulation by reference, FSNs are not regulatory and do not create or change a regulatory requirement. A change of a regulatory requirement may come in the form of a Directive. A Flight Safety Notification is not a Directive.

Applicability

This Flight Safety Notification is applicable to all FSN's issued by the Jamaica Civil Aviation Authority (JCAA).

The numbering system has been revised to place all four digits of the year of issue immediately after each prefix. The following are the prefixes assigned to the sub-divisions within the Flight Safety Department:

AD (Aerodromes); AN (Air Navigation Services); AW (Airworthiness); CS (Cabin Safety); DG (Dangerous Goods); FA (Facilitation); OP (Operations); SE (Security). AN FSN which is of a general nature will bear the designation GN (General).

The last two digits indicate the number of FSNs issued by that sub-division for the year. All revised FSNs will retain the original issue number, but will add a revision number, placed in the right hand top corner of the document on each page, followed by a revision date. Therefore FSN-AW-2015-01 indicates the following:

FSN FLIGHT SAFETY NOTIFICATION

AW Information issued by the Airworthiness sub-division of the Flight Safety

Department

2015: Issued during the calendar year 2015

01: The first FSN issued by the Airworthiness sub-division for the year.

Were this FSN to be amended, it would retain its original number (FSN-AW-2015-01) but would become Revision: 1 and the date of the revision added (June 30, 2016).

Effectivity

This Flight Safety Notification is effective immediately.

Definitions

Subsequent to the issue of FSN-G01-01 (Re-issued January 2004), the Authority has seen the need to revise the classification and numbering system of all Flight Safety Notifications (FSN), to add a revision status to each document, and to make them available online. This FSN details the new classification and explains the revised numbering system.
